 - a. Each member brought a friend.

 - a. Manistique wants retraining for project KidSight.
- 5. Attended council of governors making friends.
- 6. Looking for another assistant with Project KidSight as I will be getting busier with the run for Governor.

- A. Bark River Park Project: Lion Jane Lanaville
 - 1. Submitted report- \$52,000 raised, still needs just over \$14,000. Has till
 - Project Survey done- township does not own the land. May have to move to other township park. Will be looking at the variables and coming up with a plan.
 - 3. Needs fundraising ideas.
- B. Tour da Yoop review: Lions Gary Perala and Chris Smith
 - 1. Starting July 26th for 7th annual-goal is to raise \$149,000.
 - 2. Cancer meeting- interactive project for kids with the riders- "Ride with me in the UP".
 - a. Childs face on little bike that travels with a rider and riders take pics with it at various locations and share it with the kids.
 - 3. Adopt a rider for clubs to learn about riders, cheer them on, etc.
- C. All State Band: PID Jenny Ware
 - 1. Founded in 1978 when we had a candidate for the International President.
 - 2. Currently have 45 members with 11 from the UP.
 - a. This is a life changing event for the kids.
 - b. Over \$6299/member.
 - c. In the past- most clubs have helped members.

- d. This is the most members we have had in the band in years.
- e. Jen has no way to reach out to the students because of confidentiality- please share any contact info with Jenny so she can contact the newest band members.
 - i. Lion Kurt suggested to Jenny that Jenny give her info to the band director to give to the parents. She has tried this.
 - ii. Is also trying to prevent the each club from getting requests from each member.

-Donation deadline? No- students have payment schedules to cover reservations on airline tickets, etc.

- D. Bay Cliff: PDG Bill Rowe/ZC Kris Patterson:
 - 1. Work Day/ SHF Gala review- Lion Kris Patterson- Due to changes in leadership at Baycliff, I am struggling to get information from them.
- E. Childhood Cancer: Lion Chris Smith/Lion Deb Petkus-Perry
- 1. News letter going out. Parents involved in newsletter. If having an event or fundraiser let us know.
- 2. More children have been identified and are working with those families to make an impact with them.
- a. 2 Menominee, 1 Marquette, 1 Kingsford, 1 Munising- heard from other parents.
 - b. Information is spreading, using website to fill out applications.
- c. Lion Ron working with the CEO with the Marshfield clinic to get our name out in that facility.
 - 3. Received a donation from Meijer's.
- F. Diabetes: ZC Gary Perala
 - 1. DAD was a grant program. Need to make a brand change back to Diabetes Awareness and Action to realign with other Lions programs.

Motion made to rebrand to Diabetes Awareness and Action- (PDG Jim Svinicki/Lion Gary Perala) - Approved.

- G. Hunger: ZC Gary Perala/Lion Steve Finley
 - 1. Lion Gary-submitted report and looking forward to year ahead.
- H. Environment: DG Dan Perkins
 - 1. Lion Dan- working with Partridge Creek Compost thru the Farm to spread the idea of farm to school and composting.
 - 2. Working on a new leaflet.
 - 3. Looking at a grassroots grant that involves 10-30 million dollar grants.
 - 4. The farm is growing and budgeted for next year.

- 5. K-12 technical educator coming on line and spreading. Negaunee school on board.
- I. Partridge Creek Farm Update-see above.
- J. Vision: Project Kid Sight: 2VDG Colleen Maki
 - 1. Not much going on right now.
 - 2. Convention committee will be letting us stuff bags at the convention to prepare us for the summer vision screening season.
 - 3. UP State Fair screening sent a kid to doctor with referral- office called requesting assistance and shared how accurate the camera was in aligning with the physicians report.
 - 4. Colleen has a list of 6-8 people requesting camera training. Coordinating with Rose.
 - -PDG Jim Svinicki Rapid Rive wants trailer for Memorial Day
- K. Hearing Preservation and Awareness: 1VDG Scott Kwarciany
 - 1. Lion Scott- assistance runs through the foundation now. Applications and paperwork on line.
- L. District Newsletter/ Website/ Social Media: PDG Gretchen Preston
 - 1. Newsletter is going well. IT report shows the numbers.
 - 2. Please feel free to write articles, etc. to PDG Gretchen Preston.
 - 3. Comes out the first Monday of each month.
- -What if team reaches out to each club and highlights each club in a version of the newsletter.
 - -PID Jenny Ware- we need to see numbers of who is opening and where is it being viewed (countries).

- 4. Newsletter would like to purchase and interactive program- but there is no budget. Could purchase a program for as little as \$49/year.
 - -Can this go through the technology grant?
 - -Per PID Jenny Ware- request can be submitted to cabinet.
 - A. Motion made to purchase the software for the Lions newsletter. Asking for \$80 in the event the sale is over. (PID Jenny Ware/Lion Lee Rowe.)
 - -Discussion around this being needed to renew annually?
 - Try it for 1 year and then see if the local Lions actually participate. We can budget for this if the trial goes well.
 - -Motion passed.

- N. LCIF: PDG Matt Doney
 - 1. Lion Matt- 16 clubs have contributed. Shooting for 38.
 - 2. Report submitted.
 - -Thank PDG Jim Svinicki for encouraging clubs to support LCIF.
- -Lion Jenny shared some numbers on how many people have been helped through LCIF donations.
- O. 2024 Convention: Convention Chair Gary Perala/PDG Gretchen Preston/Lion Amy Lerlie
 - 1. Lion Gary Perala- can start making hotel reservations.
 - Info packets are coming out shortly
 - 2. Events are pretty squared up as well as the speaker and other special quests.
 - 3. Ad sales are currently on going.
 - -Please do not go to corporate sponsors requesting money without coordinating with the committee first.
 - 4. Menu is being coordinated.
